Take a Journey to the Cross and find New Life



Maundy Thursday: "Maundy" means "command". On the night before Jesus was betrayed and crucified, he spoke this commandment to his disciples. They had just shared the Last Supper (a meal of bread and wine), and Jesus was washing the disciples' feet when he said,

"A new commandment I give to you, just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" ~ John 13:34

On Maundy Thursday, we share bread & wine, in remembrance. Celebrating communion marks the story of Jesus, how he gave himself completely to give us a better life, a new start, and a fresh relationship with God.

What's so Good About Good Friday?

Judas betrayed Jesus for 30 silver coins. The Pharisees and Pontius Pilate got rid of a popular, influential preacher. If the disciples called it "good," it was only after later encountering the risen Christ. Would Jesus say it was "good"? The scene at Gethsemane, the night before, was agonizing, as Jesus begged his Father to spare him from his awful mission.

The term "Good Friday" first occurred in the fourth century. Some think it was originally called "God's Friday." Today we can call it "Good Friday" if we truly appreciate the fact that Jesus' trial, punishment and death brought our salvation.

"Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit." ~ John 19:30

Easter Sunday: Amid the excitement of the Easter bunny and chocolate, remember to joyfully celebrate Christ's resurrection. What a wonderful thing to gather and sing "He Lives". But resurrection is only a starting point for "living a new life" or "reaching out to help others". If Jesus could rise from the dead, we can go into the world knowing that God's power can transform us. We are an Easter people.


